

Unpacking 19th Century Musical Treasures from

Archduke Rudolph's Musikalien Register Dr9 Datahase

A newly digitalized catalog of music by Beethoven's student, Archduke Rudolph, has opened access to musical treasures for musicologists worldwide. Muskalien Register Nr 9, contains more than 18,000 musical scores. Dr. Stephen Husarik is converting this handwritten document to a new online database that will make classical music more readily available to scholars and performing musicians alike. The transcription has already proven its importance by uncovering a half dozen works by Anna Amalia, Duchess of Sachsen-Weimar, that were previously thought lost.

Dr. Husarik will talk about the process of transcription, problems encountered, new discoveries, and alternative uses of this catalog in music history. The presentation is illustrated and contains musical examples.
